Wisdom of St Charles OFM

God does not command us to live in hairshirts and chains, or to chastise our flesh with scourges, but to love Him above all things and our neighbour as ourselves

St Charles of Sezze is not a well-known saint. In this article, John Jennings, of the Galway Fraternity, introduces us to this impressive Franciscan.

Born to poor farmers, Charles was admitted to the order at San Francesco convent in Nazzano and received the habit in 1635. Later he reflected that his vocation came from a need to follow a life of poverty and beg alms for the love of Christ. He wanted to go on the missions, but ill health prevented it. He never requested priestly ordination, despite his parent's protests. (They had dressed him up when a toddler in Franciscan Robes, with cord and hood). He had various duties in several friaries: he was a cook, a gardener, a beggar, none of which he was particularly skilled or qualified for. It is reported that he set fire to the kitchen of a Friary while cooking. He was seen by some as a 'disaster waiting to happen'. However, sometimes with the sign of the cross he was able to multiply food for those who needed it. He noted specifically that the more food the Friary gave to the poor, the more was donated. The Lord, in reward, gave him many charisms which he attempted to keep hidden. He had hidden stigmata and gifts of miracles and prophecies. He was often sought out for advice by prominent ecclesiastics and three different popes. He put his insights into writing: 'The Grandeurs of the Mercies of God'. He died at the friary in 1670 and was canonized by Pope St John XXIII in 1959.
