Michael Linehan's 75th Anniversary of Profession

Cork OFS member Michael Linehan celebrated the 75th Anniversary of his Profession on 15th October. At the end of the Fraternity Mass recently, Michael renewed his profession promise and received anew the Blessing of St. Francis from Spiritual Assistant Fr. Michael Holland. At a function afterwards Michael shared memories of his early years in the Fraternity which he joined when he was sixteen. His father and two brothers were also members. He was one of twenty-one professions on that night in 1950, Fr. Henry OFM being the Director at the time. As was customary at the time members took a new name on profession, Michael taking that of Ambrose. Michael explained that membership of the Third Order was seen as a natural expression of Catholic practice for young men. His long and loyal commitment is proof of the great value he has placed on his membership up to this day.

Indulgences for the Holy Souls

Catholics in this life have the extraordinary gift of being able to help the Holy Souls by carrying out prayers and works authorised by the Church (ref. CCC 1479). A Plenary indulgence (which **will release** a soul from **purgatory**) is available on each of the **first 8 days** of November subject to the usual conditions. Let us help the Holy Souls this November with our prayers. What the Church requires is not difficult and besides, we will have eight new very grateful friends in heaven! A **partial** indulgence, such as praying the Rosary, performing a work of charity and other acts of piety approved by the Church can be offered for the Holy Souls at any time. The revised Apostolic Constitution of Pope St. Paul VI is available on the Vatican website: [Indulgenciarum Doctrina \(January 1, 1967\)](http://indulgenciarumdoctrina.vatican.va) More recently, in the 2024 Bull *Spes non confundit* (Ordinary Jubilee of 2025) Pope Francis again emphasized the remedial power of indulgences: “the indulgence... removes the residual effects of sin... always by the grace of Christ”. He links this removal to a renewed call to forgiveness: “the experience of full forgiveness cannot fail to open our hearts... to the need to forgive others (ref *Magisterium AI*).
